



Investigating different structured formats for communicating the evidence, our certainty in the evidence, and evidence-based recommendations

Abstract

Questions remain on how we should best communicate evidence from high quality systematic reviews (using GRADE and summary of findings tables), recommendations from guidelines (sometimes called plain language recommendations) and how we can present our certainty in this evidence. This sometimes takes the form of icon arrays, presenting results in natural frequencies, infographics, public versions of guidelines etc. Ensuring the public understand the evidence is critical for decision making related to healthy behaviour and choices, including shared decision making. This PhD will investigate and test different evidence communication formats to improve health promotion in CALD and other communities.

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
