The Catherine Southwell-Keely Travel Grant for 2023

Applicants must be an honours student, a student undertaking a Higher Degree or a postdoctoral Early Career researcher. Applicants must be part of an Australian or New Zealand University as a student, researcher, tutor, research assistant or affiliate or have held such a position within the last ten years.

Applicants must be undertaking research in the archaeology of Egypt, Cyprus or Western Asia and must demonstrate need for extensive travel, to pursue research in the above geographical areas. Furthermore, applicants must be applying for funding for the specified research project. Value: \$3500.

The Leone Crawford Travel Grant for 2023

Applicants must be an honours student, a student undertaking a Higher Degree or a postdoctoral Early Career researcher. Applicants must be part of an Australian or New Zealand University as a student, researcher, tutor, research assistant or affiliate or have held such a position within the last ten years. Applicants must pursue overseas archaeological site research in the geographical areas in which the NEAF from time to time conducts research and must be applying for funding for the specified research project. Value: \$5000

The Sam Eames Grant-in-Aid for 2023

Applicants must be an honours student, a student undertaking a Higher Degree or a postdoctoral Early Career researcher. Applicants must be part of an Australian or New Zealand University as a student, researcher, tutor, research assistant or affiliate or have held such a position within the last ten years. Applicants must be undertaking research in the archaeology of Egypt, Cyprus or Western Asia and must be applying for funding for the specified research project. Maximum value: \$1500.

General Grants-in-Aid for 2023

Applicants must be an honours student, a student undertaking a Higher Degree or a postdoctoral Early Career researcher. Applicants must be part of an Australian or New Zealand University as a student, researcher, tutor, research assistant or affiliate or have held such a position within the last ten years. Applicants must be undertaking research in the archaeology of Egypt, Cyprus or Western Asia and must be applying for funding for the specified research project. Value: up to \$5000 to be distributed in the form of one or more grants at the Council's discretion.
